Ecological Photography

A constraints-led approach for Landscape Photography

What is Ecological Photography, and what's a constraints-led approach?

It's about the connection between humans and our environment and how we create artistic images that convey more profound meaning to us.

A constraints-led approach is how we adapt to what nature gives us. By being aware of our surroundings and their unique properties, we can make thoughtful decisions about our composition, rather than relying on typical isolated learning of repetitive actions and camera settings.

Ecological Dynamics is used primarily in sports and physical movement. However, let's explore how we can apply this theory to the creative arts using James Gibson's Ecological Approach to Visual Perception.


Lightroom Classic Workflow

An intuitive method for processing your images


A deep dive into the simple things that you haven't been using to better your workflow in the classic photo editor.
